Querying us first by first-class letter or e-mail, including your proposed topic and length, is recommended before submitting a manuscript.

Book reviewing: Book reviews provide a more likely route to publication than the invited, themed contributions outlined above. Contributors interested in submitting book reviews (including more substantial book review essays that would review relevant scholarship on the topic) are encouraged to query by first-class letter or e-mail. Proposals, which can be independent of our issue themes, should specify recent book releases that will interest our readership of teachers and teacher educators.
